"How did you get involved with that?!!???" and the list goes on.

As I answer the questions, what stops them dead is that I get up before the sun in order to be a part of this sport. To most that is absurd. People are baffled as to why I would be willing to sacrifice sleep to haul baskets, tarps and fans then aimlessly drive around in search of a floating piece of fabric.

So I started thinking about why I am willing to do just that.

Before ballooning I was rarely witness to the calm and magic of the world before dawn (unless I had stayed up all night and then I was in no condition to notice). The world is amazing as it begins to wake up from the long dark night and I am always grateful when I get to experience this time of day. The people come next on my list, in just over a year of ballooning I have met some wonderful people and have fun every time we are together. The sense of camaraderie among the ballooning 'family' is refreshing. I also love how our crew falls into a comfortable routine when we start unpacking and setting up for inflation, we're a team. I have a difficult time selecting words to describe how I feel about witnessing a balloon inflate, I have a sense of awe each time. When the sun pokes its head from behind the horizon I stop for a moment to appreciate the day and soak in the world as it wakes.

Then there is the chase. Watching the balloon float gently above the trees and houses, stopping for a photo or two, searching the map (or GPS system) for a road that will take us north, west, or where ever, laughing with the rest of the team, seeing folks stop their morning routine for a moment to watch the balloon – all without traffic – what could be better than that?

And of course, the times I get to hop into the basket and experience the heart of our sport are like sitting at the edge of the sea. The peaceful feeling that washes over me as I fly and the way my perspective on what is important in my life is realigned as I look at the world from above, these are the rewards.

So when someone asks me why I would be willing to sacrifice sleep to haul baskets, tarps and fans and then aimlessly drive around in search of a floating piece of fabric, I say — "It gets in your blood."




